




WORD OF WELCOME BY THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR:







PHOEBE HAS A FINANCIAL/BUSINESS BACKGROUND AND WORKS AS A CONSULTANT WITH ONE OF CANADA'S "BIG FIVE" BANKS. HER INTEREST IN COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT SPANS FROM HER MOTHERLAND KENYA, WHERE SHE WAS INVOLVED IN EDUCATING AND ENHANCING GRASSROOT COMMUNITIES ON FINANCIAL PRUDENCE AND MANAGEMENT IN THE EARLY STAGES OF HER CAREER. SHE SERVED THE CLUB AS ITS TREASURER AND 3 TERM PRESIDENT. SHE HAS SERVED HER LIONS A711 DISTRICT AS A ZONE CHAIR AND REGIONS CHAIR AND IS CURRENTLY THE CHAIR OF THE NEW VOICES INITIATIVE COMMITTEE. 

Veronica De Santos, an 8th-Degree Black Belt in Taekwondo is the Grandmaster and founder of Desantos Martial Arts. She was born in Prospect, East Bank Demerara, Guyana where she was the youngest of 10 children. She moved to Canada when she was 16 and quickly started her martial arts training. In 1979, she started competing at a high level and was awarded the Ontario Amateur Athlete Award in 1981, that same year she was also ranked Number 1 Female Fighter in the Karate circuit.

Veronica was ranked Canada's #1 female fighter from 1982–1990 and in 1994, she represented Canada at the Goodwill Games in St. Petersburg, Russia. In 1999, She became the first woman to be inducted in the North American Martial Arts Hall of Fame and in 2016, she was inducted into the Canadian Black Belt Hall of Fame.

Growing up, she was often told that martial arts was not a place or activity for a woman. She wanted to share her love of the Martial Arts in a non-threatening, inclusive environment where all ages, gender and abilities could find a place to shine and be their best. To that end, in 1988 she used her rent money to travel to Boston, USA where she competed in a martial arts tournament and became Grand Champion which earned her the U.S.\$5,000 prize that allowed her a plane ticket back home with enough money left over to pay her rent and open the martial art school. Less than one month later, DeSantos Martial Arts opened its doors.

Veronica also believes in giving back to the community. She started a non-profit organisation — The DeSantos Foundation – which includes an annual fund-raising walk, starting at the Main street Desantos studio in Toronto and ends at the world-famous Niagara Falls. The funds raised by the foundation go to a variety of causes, which include school breakfast programmes, both locally and internationally.

Esther has been working in the human service field for over 30 years. She is a great advocate and leader on issues of gender-based violence, anti-racism, anti-oppression and economic empowerment of women for financial sustainability and security. As the executive director of WMRCC of Durham, she continues to develop numerous innovative programs and services to support the populations the organization serves. She facilitated the development of 7 worker cooperative groups for newcomers and immigrant women in 2019. She is highly committed to ensuring that women, youth, and children from diverse backgrounds receive effective and efficient services; as well as maintaining a work environment that is free from all forms of oppressions. She values workplace safety as she views workplace as people's second homes.

She puts a lot of emphasis on diversity, equity, inclusion, equality, human rights, and social justice. Accordingly, she deems it necessary to partner with several community organizations and stakeholders in developing culturally competency programs and services. In her view, an intersectional approach to gender-based violence and economic empowerment of women and girls requires a strong understanding of how various forms of oppressions inter-twine and impact the lives of vulnerable women and girls




