Uzima Activities

The activities of Uzima are carried out in both Canada and internationally. However, the fundraising activities and training of volunteers are mainly executed in Canada. Since the founding Directors and board members are people from developing countries there is a key focus on empowering women and men who are interested in helping on projects based in developing countries.

Project Activities in Canada:

Covid_19 has greatly impacted Uzima's usual functioning. In response to Covid_19 we adjusted a multitude of our projects and workshops to ensure that they could be conducted online. Given the reduction of restrictions and the slow move back to in-person gatherings and meetings throughout Ontario, Uzima has proceeded to plan more in person events, projects and workshops - including but not limited to the seniors grocery assistance and the CSMARI introductory meeting/workshop.



Promoting French language services in Black communities in Toronto:

The goal of this project is to reach out to Black French speaking people in Toronto and the GTA. Uzima provides services to marginalized communities with a focus on Black communities in Toronto and beyond. Programs at Uzima include support for gender-based violence survivors who are majority women, children, and youth.

The project aims to provide more access to French resources to Uzima's community. It consists of weekly French tutoring classes to aid those who want to learn the language but are limited by socio-economic and personal barriers. The classes are taught by multilingual Francophones that speak and write fluently in French but can communicate in other languages.

This will allow Uzima to aid more people in getting access to helpful resources related to many of our projects, such as mental health, the COVID-19 pandemic, Human trafficking prevention and helping lower income families, especially those who can only speak and understand French.

Enhancing Senior’s Wellness and Safety:

This project targets Black seniors aged 55 years and over in Toronto who are experiencing elder abuse as well as the adverse effects of COVID-19. Uzima is concerned about elder abuse because it affects seniors across all socio- economic groups, cultures, and races.

The objectives of this project include providing information on elder abuse including financial abuse, training seniors in new technology to virtually navigate financial systems, and engaging seniors in the community through mentoring others on financial safety to reduce the incidence of abuse among Black seniors.

Gender Based Violence (GBV) /Shock proofing:


This project involves helping Black women and girls in Toronto and the GTA cope with adverse effects of the pandemic using culturally appropriate approaches. It also supports them in moving beyond the pandemic.

GBV increased during the pandemic and there is urgent need for Uzima to continue and expand the recently ended project on building the capacity of Uzima to support Black women during the pandemic.

OTF Resilience Fund:

This project focuses on building the capacity of Uzima to learn virtual technology to support community due to COVID 19

The program provides training to the board and staff to successfully carry out required tasks for Uzima projects while also enhancing Uzima's services and programs to serve clients better. Through training the program will adapt and re-imagine the delivery of programs and services.

The project will also help Uzima identify new health and safety processes and required personal protective equipment (PPE) technological supports to deal with challenges brought about by COVID-19. Uzima will adapt to the shift to more virtual elements in its work to make work completely accessible in virtual spaces. Uzima will engage public health and other professionals in processes such as correct and consistent use of (PPE), mental and physical health and wellbeing supports etc.

In addition, the program will enable Uzima to increase its ability to access financial resources and develop new and alternative sources of revenues. The team will learn to use e-marketing and social media to reach out to donors. Staff will develop new fundraising plans, identify fundraising and financial technological resources, seek opportunities for public-private partnerships and social enterprises to sustain the program.

Tropicana:

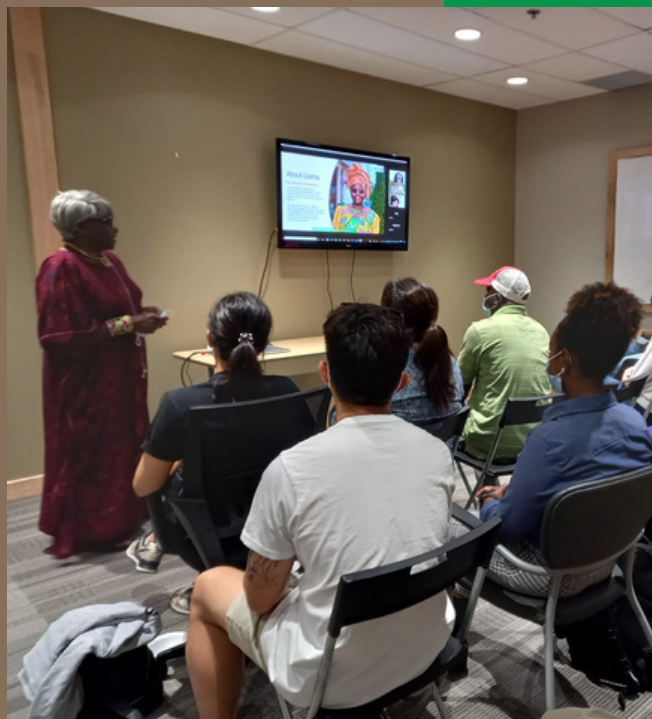
Another new project Uzima is working on is Tropicana which focuses on Strengthening Uzima's Operational Management Effectiveness to Cope with the Increased Needs Of Black Communities In Toronto Due To COVID-19. With improved financial and operational management, Uzima will increase its credibility to funders and attract more multi-year funding for projects to better serve the needs of such communities. We hope to start our first set of workshops for internal staff this month to improve personal management and encourage both growth and sustainability.



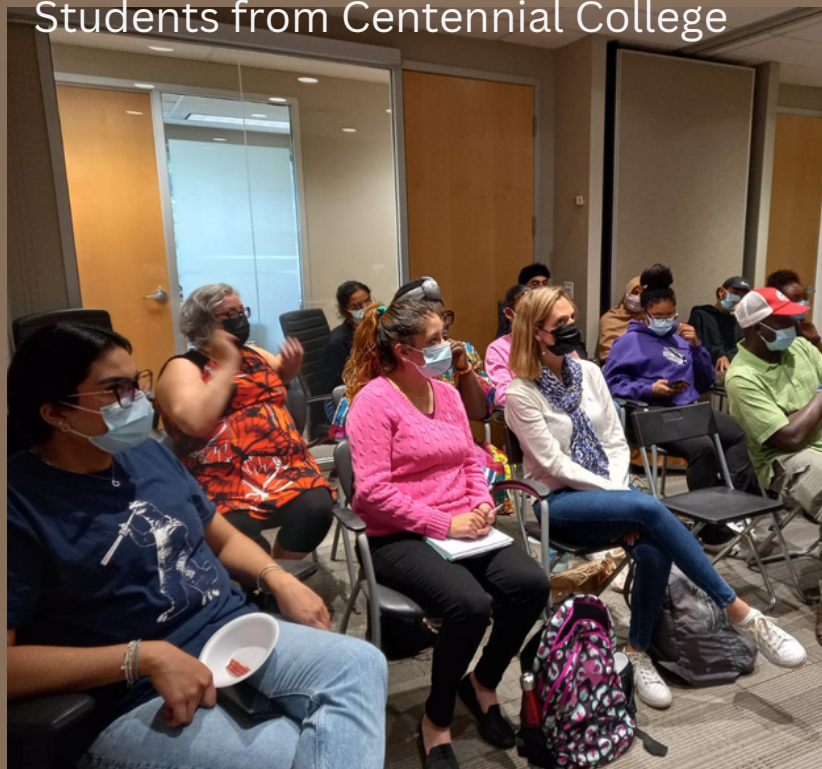
Community Support Multiculturalism and Antiracial Initiatives (CSMARI):

This project aims to build the capacity of Uzima to serve diverse racialized communities in Toronto and the GTA. It will enable Uzima to support communities in confronting racism, engaging in discussions on diversity and strengthening research and evidence to build understanding of the disparities and challenges faced by racialized and religious minority communities as well as indigenous people.

The project will enable Uzima to have an effective organizational structure with functioning key systems in place. The Board and staff will be equipped with knowledge in crucial areas like strategic planning, financial and human resource management. The board and staff of Uzima will gain skills in virtual communication using various electronic devices to provide services virtually during the pandemic. Training in Financial health will empower Uzima to implement programs and sustain them through periods of limited funding.

Financial stability at Uzima will be the foundation of successful programs. A well-trained board and staff will ensure that the needs of diverse groups are embraced in a culturally appropriate manner. More programs advocating for equality will be sustained at Uzima hence continuous services for racialized and other marginalized groups. There will be stronger partnership development, collaboration, and networking among service providers.

SUVAT BLUE/YVHTPP

This program is a youth violence and human trafficking prevention program with a broad scope on educating and empowering youth by building digital media platforms. It is formed from the Ministry of Children, Community and Social Services by the provincial government.

The program networks youth as a peer resource for each other. The program began last summer and is building a sustainable digital media library in addition to providing a series of informative workshops to youth on a variety of topics.

It has also been branded as SUVAT BLUE. The name came from the words “survivors” and “anti-trafficking” combined.

The Kindred project is one of Uzima's newest projects that is focused on providing mental health support to Black youth communities. The program will include workshops, mentorship and leadership opportunities, pro social activities, etc. Selected Black youth will also form an advisory committee to lead and execute the project activities. This project is also a youth led project.

Kenyan Chapter

On June 11, 2022, Uzima ran a 2 day workshop in Western Kenya. The ongoing initiative was to empower every participant to grow their own food within minimal confines of space. Kitchen gardening was the strategy behind this where organic farming maximized the effectiveness of yielding crop. As a result, the gardener would harvest highly nutritious food for consumption, to farm without replacing seeds for multiple seasons, and to profit from selling if commercial. Multiple guest speakers such as Ben Kiplagat led the event with lectures and demonstration on how to maximize produce using the equipment. Also, religious leaders, healthcare providers, and other professionals joined our Director Jacobet Wambayi PhD in making the event a success.

Uzima Women Relief Group International is launching a Kenyan chapter. There is an opportunity to participate in membership to grow the organization in that region.
