Edith's International experience includes assignment to Bangladesh with Canadian Public Health Association/Canadian International Immunization Initiative/WHO/CDC/UNICEF where she provided technical advice to the Ministry of Health and participated in the Polio eradication and other vaccine preventable diseases initiatives. To provide care and support to families affected by the effects of war and disease in Canada in order to contribute to the global efforts to relieve poverty and improve women's health and education.



Leading a project that aims to enhance Uzima's capacity in delivering French Language Services. Uzima already provides services to marginalized communities with a focus on Black communities in Toronto and beyond. The development of this project will allow us to further expand our target group to Francophones who may miss essential services and resources. We are planning to start by conducting French classes beginning at the end of July for our staff and members who are interested in further increasing their language capabilities.

YVHTPP:

The ongoing Youth Violence and Human Protection Program has made continuous progress in targeting vulnerable populations and youth in Toronto and beyond. We have just concluded our last two focus group discussions that provide many resources and help for youth covering topics such as financial literacy.

We will now be moving on to our next set of workshops that will raise youth awareness on different social topics and challenges, as one of the objectives of YVHTPP, we are scheduling youth workshops on different topics, including job readiness/employmentrelated topics that will begin by the end of this month.
