Uzima Kenya Training Program April 2023

Jacobet traveled to Kenya in April 2023 and met with community members. A two day training workshop was conducted with the women groups supported by Uzima Canada. Over 70 participants attended the training with majority being women and girls. Some of the previously trained women as well as professional farmers provided the training this year. Topics of training included cone farming started in 2022. This method enables farmers to use limited space that can be well watered during the dry season. More vegetables are grown in a smaller space saving land for other farming activities.

Women groups trained in 2022 shared the success of their projects which enhanced kitchen gardening thus improving nutrition for families. Participants were also taught how to improve their dairy farming, poultry, and other animals farming. Participants visited local farms in Nakuru county where they learnt how to dry local vegetables and preserve them for use during the dry season.

Youth participants presented on mental health and sexual health affecting many youth. Youth discussed the effects of COVIDD-19 on everyone's mental health especially the youth. They shared prevention methods to keep families healthy.

BBI RACE • ING TO COMMUNITY • EXCELLENCE CONFERENCE


The Race.ing to Community Excellence Conference was held from March 15th to March 17th, 2023, in Halifax, Nova Scotia, as part of the Supporting Black Canadian Communities Initiative (SBCCI). The conference aimed to empower Black-led organizations and support Black Canadian communities. Uzima was well represented by Our Executive Director Jacobet Wambayi, Amina Musa the Board Chair, and Jane Mbae the Programs Coordinator.

The SBCCI, a federally funded initiative, has played a significant role in addressing the historic underfunding of Black not-for-profit organizations in Canada. The Black Business Initiative (BBI) has been an Intermediary administering the SBCCI Capacity Building Grant for the past three years, providing over \$12.4 million in funding to 352 projects. The grants have helped organizations diversify their income sources, strengthen governance, undergo digital transformation, and create spaces that serve their communities.

Shockproofing Communities National Summit

Shockproofing Communities National Summit, a national summit for gender justice and gender based violence organizations and leaders, was held at the Shaw Centre in Ottawa from March 27-30, 2023. Jackie was honoured to attend in person while other Uzima staff attended online. The summit was At the beginning of Summit as well as at the end, participants paid respect to the Algonquin people, who are the traditional guardians of the land in and around Ottawa, which remains unceded and unsurrendered. The opening and closing of this event are important moments to reflect on and express our joint commitment to the Calls to Action from the Truth and Reconciliation Commission and the Calls to Justice from the Inquiry into Murdered and Missing Indigenous Women, Girls and Two Spirit (MMIWG2SLGBTQQIA+).

Algonquin Elders attended the summit, offered prayers, and facilitated sharing circles, and provided support and guidance to those from various Indigenous communities, performed ceremonial moments, and shared their knowledge and blessings. These respected Elders are keepers of traditional teachings, cultural knowledge, spiritual connections and wisdom.

First Nations and Métis elders performed smudging ceremonies, and Inuit elders lit a qulliq (a traditional Inuit lamp made from soapstone and seal oil). They also facilitated sharing circles, and provide support and guidance to those from various Indigenous communities and to all those attending this conference.

Uzima Women Relief Group International (Uzima) is looking for Board of Directors. Although we are open to all racial groups, we especially encourage Black, and People of Color, and others currently less represented in our governance groups to consider joining us in these important leadership roles. board member you will observe these policies and help other members, staff and volunteers to adhere to them. Uzima would like to stress further that commitment to the board duties, constitution and by-laws is a requirement.

Because Uzima is still evolving, the board is both a working board and a governance board. Board members are therefore expected to help with activities such as administration, accounting and fundraising. The following is a summary of the responsibilities of the board:

• Attend all board and committee meetings, functions and be prepared to participate.

• Stay informed about board and committee matters, review and comment on minutes and reports.

• Stay informed about the organization's mission, services, policies, and programs.

• Follow developments in the community, economy, government, etc. that may affect the organization.

• Serve on committees and offer to take on special assignments.

• Make a personal financial contribution to the organization (usually in Annual membership fees)

- Participate in organizational fundraising.
- Inform your networks about the organization.
