Uzima's Current Projects

FRENCH PROJECT PROMOTING FRENCH LANGUAGE SERVICES IN BLACK COMMUNITIES IN TORONTO

Uzima's projects would further be able to cater to French speakers in the GTA by providing more French resources, French presentations, and shared documents by Uzima in French. This will allow Uzima to aid more people in getting access to helpful resources related to many of our projects, such as mental health, the COVID-19 pandemic, Human trafficking prevention and helping lower income families, especially those who can only speak and understand French.

ENHANCING SENIOR'S WELLNESS AND SAFETY

The objectives of this project will include providing information on elder abuse including financial abuse, training seniors in new technology to virtually navigate financial systems, and engaging seniors in the community through mentoring others on financial safety to reduce the incidence of abuse toward them.



GENDER BASED VIOLENCE(GBV) /SHOCK PROOFING

This project will enable Uzima to review and adapt service approaches and programs to serve Black women and girls in Toronto. GBV increased during the pandemic and there is urgent need for Uzima to continue and expand the recently ended project on building the capacity of Uzima to support Black women during the pandemic.

OTF RESILIENCE FUND

Building the capacity of Uzima to learn virtual technology to support community due to COVID-19. This project engages hired professional consultants in health and safety, technology and IT, digital marketing, and more.

TROPICANA

Engaging in board and staff on governance and management, HR management, Policy development, accounting, strategic planning, finance and administration, tactical planning, volunteer management, COVID-19 planning, information technology and media public relations.



SUVAT BLUE/YVHTPP

The program formed from the Ministry of Children, Community and Social Services by the provincial government. It is a youth violence and human trafficking prevention program with a broad scope on educating and empowering youth by building digital media platforms.

The program begun last summer and a series of workshops on a variety of topics were covered. They were attended by multicultural youth and adults.

The program networks youth as a peer resource for each other. The program is building a sustainable digital media library. This will involve making content of videos, photographs, blogs, and a podcast. There is also a website and social media platforms that have branded the project called SUVAT BLUE. The name came from the words "survivors" and "anti-trafficking" combined.

Eventually, focus groups of Black youth were conducted from March 2022 and are currently ongoing. Some of them agreed to be interviewed in person on video to build toward the media library. Be on the lookout for their content.

KINDRED PROJECT

The Kindred project is focused on providing mental health support to Black youth communities. The program will include workshops, mentorship and leadership opportunities, pro social activities, etc. Selected Black youth will also form an advisory committee to lead and execute the project activities.


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
