




YVHTPP Project:

The Youth Violence Human Trafficking Prevention Program (YVHTPP), funded by the Ontario Ministry of Children, Community and Social Services, is a remarkable initiative designed to empower and uplift youth in Toronto, aged 12-29, who are considered among the most vulnerable populations. These young individuals often come from communities facing various challenges, including youth violence, human trafficking, substance abuse, and limited access to education and employment opportunities. Our YVHTPP project, spanning two years starting from May 2021, aims to make a positive impact on their lives through comprehensive support, workshops, activities, and counseling referrals. Our most recent Art Therapy workshops hosted both in-person and online , provided a safe and creative space for young individuals to express themselves and develop essential coping skills. Through these workshops, participants were encouraged to explore their emotions, thoughts, and accessibility for a wider range of youth, considering their diverse needs and circumstances.

CSRF:

The Canadian Services Recovery Fund (CSRF) is a transformative initiative aimed at enhancing Uzima's Information Technology capabilities to better serve Toronto's Black community, especially during the challenging times brought about by the COVID-19 pandemic. In response to these pressing needs, we conducted a comprehensive SWOT analysis involving Uzima's dedicated staff and board members, leading us to take proactive steps. We enlisted the expertise of digital marketing professionals and IT consultants to facilitate this transformation. This comprehensive approach involved providing essential IT support and conducting training sessions to empower our staff with the skills needed for effective virtual communication and networking. Additionally, we organized a series of workshops aimed at fortifying the IT competence and proficiency of our board members, staff, and valued volunteers. These workshops covered an array of vital topics, including leveraging Microsoft 365 tools, strategies for boosting social media engagement, performance management, human resources management, media and public relations, grant writing expertise, and innovative fundraising strategies. With these strategic investments in our IT infrastructure and skills development, we are better equipped to serve our community and address its evolving needs in the digital age.

AGE WELL AT HOME

This program is funded by the federal Government and will be carried out In collaboration with Kenya Canadian Association (KCA) and Bridge to Oasis (BTO) Foundation in Calgary.

The program focuses on building the capacity of service providers who may not be equipped with providing support for Black seniors in a culturally appropriate manner.

- Conduct virtual and in-person educational sessions to service providers to increase their understanding of the care needs that may be unique to improving the lives of Black seniors.
- 2. Expand beneficial services offered to Black seniors at Uzima, KCA and BTO to Black seniors in Toronto and Calgary.
- 3. Increase number of referrals for more specialized care and support for Black seniors.
- 4. Develop a toolbox and other resources such as fact sheets and fridge magnets to improve wellness of seniors living at home.



Black Youth Empowerment Towards Community Development (BYETCOM)

This project is funded by the Federal Government, Canada Service Corps Program – Micro-grants Diversity stream.

Activities:

- Empower 100 Black youth aged 15 30 to build life skills in leadership, resilience, and professional networking, that equip them contribute to building an inclusive Canada.
- 2. Give 100 youth aged 15 to 30 up to \$5,000 to carry out innovative shortterm service projects to strengthen youth resilience.

WOMEN RELIEF GROUP INTERNATIONAL

Uzima Women Relief Group International (Uzima) is looking for Board of Directors. Because Uzima is still evolving, the board is both a working board and a governance board. Board members are therefore expected to help with activities such as administration, accounting and fundraising. The following is a summary of the responsibilities of the board:

• Attend all board and committee meetings, functions and be prepared to participate.

• Stay informed about board and committee matters, review and comment on minutes and reports.

• Stay informed about the organization's mission, services, policies, and programs.

• Follow developments in the community, economy, government, etc. that may affect the organization.

• Serve on committees and offer to take on special assignments.

• Make a personal financial contribution to the organization (usually in Annual membership fees)

• Participate in organizational fundraising.
