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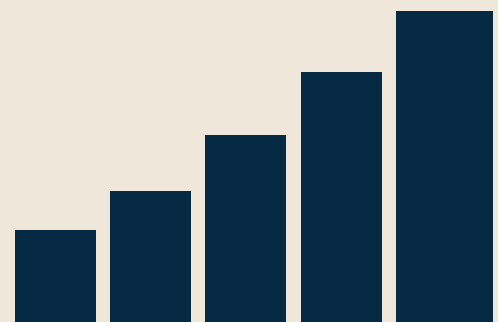
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## About Uzima

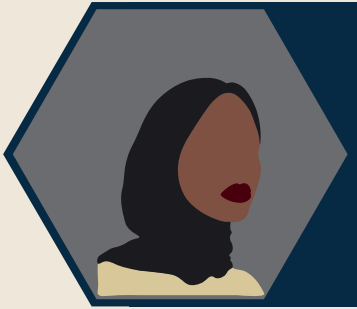

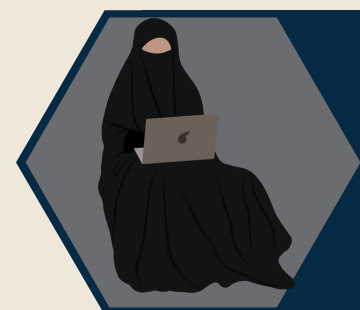

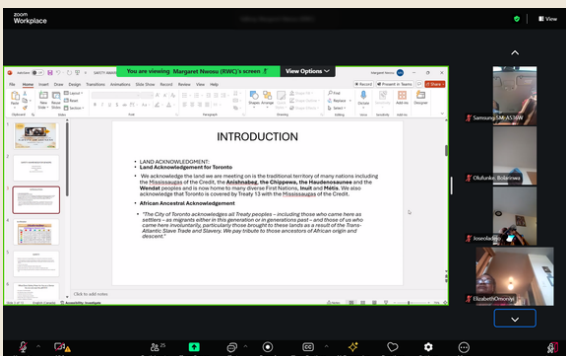
# Uzima Project Highlights

## Age Well at Home (AWAH)

Project title: Expanding effective organizational capacity to support Black seniors To Improve their lives.

Project duration: July 2023 - March 2025 (2yrs)

AWAH is a Government of Canada funded program for seniors with the goal of providing a more targeted support to Black seniors in Ontario and Calgary who are adversely affected by the effects of COVID-19. During the past winter months, we were able to evaluate the first year of the program and develop even better strategies to deliver more services to black seniors. We have strengthened our partnerships with the Kenyan Canadian Association and the Bridge To Oasis to ramp up our recruitment activities across the provinces of Ontario and Alberta. Against this backdrop, we are well on our way to reaching our target of 500 seniors this spring. As part of the project, there is a focus on building the capacity of service providers who may not be well versed with cultural appropriate approaches for supporting Black seniors in Canada. Seniors and their service providers are being engaged in a series of virtual and in-person educational sessions to increase their understanding of the care needs that may be unique to improving the lives of Black seniors.



# Uzima Project Highlights

## The Black Youth Empowerment Towards Community Development (BYETCD)

The first set of 100 youth participants of The Black Youth Empowerment Towards Community Development (BYETCD) project funded by Employment and Social Development Canada (ESDC) rounded off activities on March 31, 2024. The project empowered 100 Black youth aged 15 – 30 in pro-social activities, fostering leadership, building professional networks and gaining life skills to build an inclusive Canada.

Each participating youth received a \$5,000 micro-grant to execute innovative, short-term service projects that they conceived and planned. Even though the projects are for the benefit of the community, taking part in the project equally helps in enhancing youth resilience as everyone needs to prove their project management mettle.

Some of the objectives which the project set out to achieve for participants include Community Engagement, Inclusivity, Professional Networking, and Personal Growth. Throughout these spring months, Uzima is focused on gathering all the project reports in readiness for submission to the Government of Canada. During this period, we are also evaluating the project and its achievements to enhance the next one with the lessons learned from the past year.

## CSMARI

Community Support, Multiculturalism, and Anti-Racism Initiatives (CSMARI) Program

Project duration: Mar 2022-Mar 2024 (2yr )

CSMARI is a Govt. of Canada Project. (Canadian Heritage Capacity Building).

Project Title: “Building the capacity of Uzima to serve diverse racialized communities in Toronto and the GTA”

The CSMARI project is being implemented with the aim of supporting communities in confronting racism, engage in discussions on diversity and strengthen research and evidence to build understanding of the disparities and challenges faced by racialized and religious minority communities and indigenous people.

The project’s focus is to address capacity building needs of Uzima and partner organizations dealing with racialized communities in Toronto and GTA

Capacity building is geared towards Cultural Competence, Governance, Strategic Planning, Human Resource Management, Financial Management, Gender-Based Analysis, Partnership Building, Community Mobilization Skills, Virtual Communication Skills, Sustaining and Evaluation Process.



# Some of our Current Projects

## BYETCOM



### Black Youth Empowerment Towards Community Development (BYETCOM)

This project is funded by the Federal Government, Canada Service Corps Program – Micro-grants Diversity stream.

Encompassing this program are two pivotal objectives:

Firstly, the empowerment of 100 Black youth, ranging from ages 15 to 30, through the cultivation of essential life skills in leadership, resilience, and professional networking. These skills are deliberately tailored to equip these young individuals to make meaningful contributions toward the establishment of a more inclusive Canada.

Secondly, the provision of financial support to 100 youth, aged 15 to 30, takes the form of grants, with amounts extending up to \$5,000. This funding is strategically allocated to facilitate the implementation of innovative short-term service projects, all with the overarching goal of fortifying youth resilience.

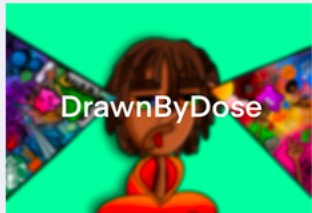

# Some of our Current Projects

## YVHTPP

The Youth Violence Human Trafficking Prevention Program (YVHTPP), generously funded by the Ontario Ministry of Children, Community and Social Services, stands as a commendable initiative crafted to empower and uplift youth in Toronto, aged 12-29, recognized as among the most vulnerable populations. These young individuals often originate from communities grappling with a multitude of challenges, including youth violence, human trafficking, substance abuse, and limited access to education and employment opportunities.

Our YVHTPP project, spanning a two-year period from May 2021, seeks to effect positive change in their lives through comprehensive support, workshops, activities, and counseling referrals. Recent Art Therapy workshops, conducted both in-person and online, provided a secure and creative environment for young individuals to articulate themselves and cultivate crucial coping skills.

Through these workshops, participants were encouraged to delve into their emotions, thoughts, and experiences using various artistic mediums, fostering self-awareness and resilience. The provision of both in-person and online options was a deliberate effort to ensure accessibility for a broader spectrum of youth, taking into account their diverse needs and circumstances.

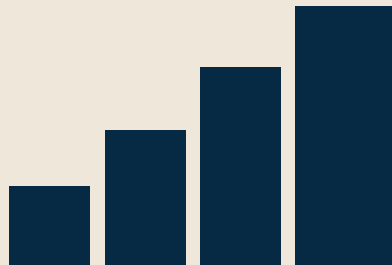
